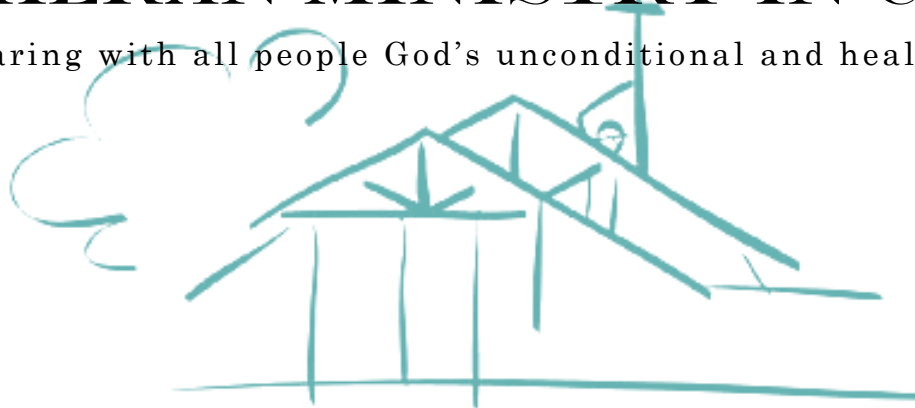

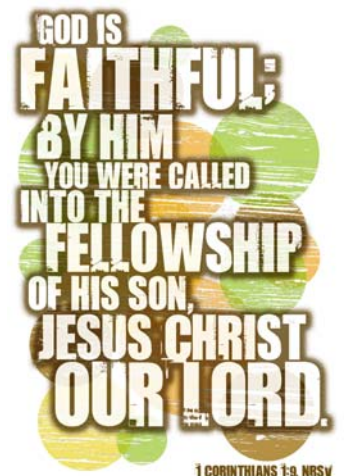
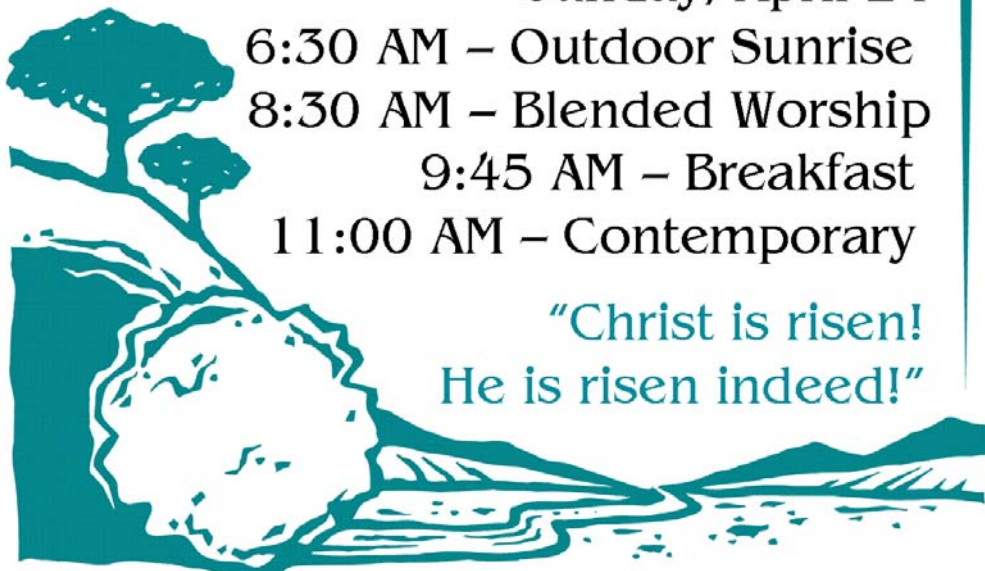

Holy Week**PALM/PASSION WEEKEND**

Traditionally the Sunday before Easter has been known as Palm Sunday. With branches of palm waving, we joyously shout, "Hosanna, hosanna!" Indeed, triumphantly Jesus enters the Holy City of Jerusalem. But quickly "hosannas" turn to "crucify," as the events of the "Passion" unfold.

On **Palm/Passion Weekend, Saturday, April 16 and Sunday, April 17**, we will explore all the emotions of this week we call "Holy."

Hosanna! Hosanna!
Crucify! Crucify!

**MAUNDY THURSDAY—APRIL 21**

This year's Maundy Thursday Service (**April 21, 7:30 PM**) will be a traditional Service of Maundy Thursday in the Worship Center. The Service will focus on the same events of the Upper Room, but in a more liturgical form. The Liturgy will begin with an expanded Order for Corporate Confession and Forgiveness with individual Absolution and Laying on of Hands. As a reminder of Jesus' example to his disciples, there is the symbolic Washing of Feet (*John 13:4-16*). The Service continues with the traditional Holy Communion as instituted at the Last Supper (*Mark 14:22-25*). The Maundy Thursday Liturgy concludes with the stripping of the Altar in preparation for a solemn Good Friday. All are welcome.

**GOOD FRIDAY—APRIL 22****Meditations**

During the traditional three hours of the Crucifixion, **noon through 3:00 PM**, you are invited to use the LMIC Worship Center as a place for meditation on the Cross. Pastor Robb will be available for Prayer and Words of Absolution. LMIC Music Director, Phil Hinton, will be on hand providing reflective music.

Evening Service

"The Sounds of GOOD FRIDAY and the PASSION of OUR LORD"

This year's Good Friday evening Service (**April 22 at 7:30 PM**) will focus our attention on the many sounds that surrounded our Lord on the day of his crucifixion: from the footsteps of Romans soldiers as they approached the Garden of Gethsemane to the mocking crowds yelling "crucify!" to the huge stone that was rolled in front of a borrowed tomb where his lifeless body would lie for three days. As we close our eyes we will be there the day they crucified our Lord. Brief meditations will not only take us back in time, but bring us closer to explore our own lives and our response to the gift of Christ's Passion for our sake.



EASTER VIGIL—APRIL 23



In the darkness, the people gather around a fire. The pastor joins the gathering, holding a large candle. The candle is lighted and leads the way into the darkened church building. It is the darkness before Easter.

The gathering described above is the beginning of the Traditional Easter Vigil. This Vigil, held on the Saturday night before Easter (**April 23**) at our regular Worship hour (**5:30 PM**), will be the first of our Easter Celebrations. The Easter Vigil features four traditional themes: Light, Word, Baptism, Eucharist. The liturgy begins with the darkness before the dawn, as the women came to the tomb with their prepared spices. Worshippers hold individual candles reminiscent of the maidens awaiting the bridegroom.

In the Early Church, all baptisms were reserved for the Easter Vigil, making it a time for each of us to reflect upon the significance of our own Baptism in our spiritual journey.

The remaining liturgy creates a sharp contrast when suddenly the lights come on and the organ is heard from the first time, “This is the feast of victory for our God. Alleluia!” By the light of the new dawn, the Risen Lord is revealed to us in Proclamation and in the celebration of Holy Communion.

EASTER SUNRISE SERVICE – APRIL 24

“Early in the morning on the first day of the week, women came to the tomb, bearing spices... He is not here!”

Even those among us who would not ordinarily consider themselves “early-risers,” can experience the uniqueness and excitement of getting up before the dawn to celebrate the first Easter Sunday Pronouncement, **“Christ is Risen, Indeed!”**

Lutheran Ministry in Christ will once again host an outdoor Easter Sunrise Service. We will sing a mixture of traditional and contemporary songs that proclaim God’s wonderful plan for Redemption. Weather permitting, chairs will be set up outside so participants will be able to experience the glory of the sunrise as we celebrate the Resurrection of Our Lord, Jesus Christ. Those who wish to bring lawn chairs may do so, but adequate seating will be available. Coffee and donuts will be available following the Service. Set your alarm and be there at **6:30 AM** Easter morning! Invite others!

MID-WEEK LENTEN WORSHIP

Our mid-week Lenten Series for 2011 continues on **Wednesday evenings at 7:30 PM through April 13.** “Lent: The Arts Tell the Story” invites each of us to reflect on the events of Jesus’ crucifixion from the perspective of various art forms. As we continue our Lenten journey through this season of preparation, may our encounters with Jesus Christ touch our hearts with great power. Holden Evening Prayer guides us in our Worship experience. Children ages 3-3rd grade will go to the Centrum during the service to learn at their level of understanding.



April 6: Music

Music is one of the Church’s earliest art forms used to convey the most powerful messages of faith, hope and love. We thank our own Music department (Blended Choir, Contemporary Worship Band, and the newly formed Hand Bell Choir) for sharing the Good News with instruments and voice.

April: 13: Visual Art Storytelling “Who Do You Say that I Am?”

There are forms of art that use no words, only pictures and images. It is rare in visual arts to watch the artist at work. This final art form in our series will allow us that experience, as drifting sands in the hands of an artist tell God’s story.

Preceding each Mid-Week Lenten Worship Service (**Wednesdays through April 13**) is “Soup and Fellowship” in the Centrum starting at **6:30 PM**, giving us plenty of time for a bowl or two of freshly prepared soup and some informal conversation and fellowship. Japan Earthquake and Pacific Tsunami

The Situation:

On March 11, one of the largest earthquakes on record with a magnitude of 8.9 struck Japan near the town of Sendai triggering tsunami warnings across the Pacific Ocean. The initial earthquake was followed by 30-foot waves, devastating Japan's coastal areas, and more than 50 aftershocks. The death toll continues to mount as assessments of the damage are underway throughout the night. Local officials are also assessing impact to new technology such as nuclear power plants, transportation and communication networks.

The Japan Evangelical Lutheran Church (JELC) has reported minimal damage to its churches in Tokyo and is assessing the full extent of impact to JELC congregations near the epicenter, particularly Sendai Lutheran Church. The President and General Secretary of JELC were in Malaysia attending a Lutheran World Federation leadership conference at the time of the earthquake. The ELCA, through the churchwide unit for Global Mission, currently has 22 missionaries serving in schools and parishes of the JELC; all have been found to be safe and secure.

ELCA Response:

The ELCA stands in solidarity with its companion on the ground, the Japan Evangelical Lutheran Church (JELC), as they assess the safety and security of its members and communities served by the church. Through its predecessor bodies, the ELCA has been present in Japan since 1892 and will accompany the JELC in its planned response to this disaster. Elsewhere in the Pacific region, the ELCA remains in contact with companions in the Pacific Islands, South America and throughout the coastal region of the U.S. to respond as needed to the tsunamis caused by the earthquake.

What you can do:

Pray:

As the news of the earthquake was announced at the leadership conference in Malaysia, a representative from the Australian Evangelical Lutheran Church, a church that has recently had to deal with massive flooding and an earthquake in New Zealand, shared that of all the out-

pouring of help from the international community received "prayer was the most important gift." Ally Streed, an ELCA missionary deployed by the Global Mission unit and stationed in Saitama, stated, "Please keep the people of Japan (and just Japan in general) in your thoughts and prayers. This is the biggest earthquake they've seen since the Kobe earthquake of 1995."

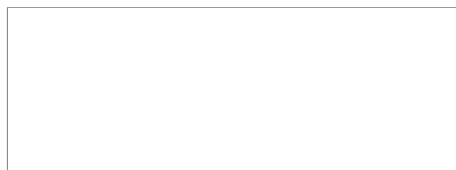
